This week began with National Sorry Day (26th May), a day of commemoration and remembrance for the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children forcibly removed from their families, communities and culture between the 1800s and the 1970s – known as the Stolen Generations. This day gives people the chance to come together and share the steps towards healing for the Stolen Generations, their families and communities. What does the word 'sorry' mean to you? Is it just a throw away word when we have done something wrong or do we try hard to think about our actions and doing something different. How does saying sorry happen in our own playground and classrooms? Perhaps this week as we reflect on National Sorry Day, we can also talk with our children about how we say sorry to others.
